No Open Mic in November. Instead, Join Us and Help Us Spread the Word about the Virtual Writers Conference on November 12!



His writing appears in *The New York Times*, *Best American Poetry*, *American Poetry Review*, and *Harvard Review*. He is a Contributing Editor at *Tab Journal* at Chapman University.

Ruben has been honored by the Department of Cultural Affairs and Special Events in the City of Chicago with an artist grant and fellowships from Canto Mundo, Lambda Literary Writers' Retreat, Community of Writers, Napa Valley Writers Conference, and Vermont Studio Center.

He has served as a coordinator for PEN America's literary awards committee and the Publishing Triangle Awards. He has taught at Vermont College of Fine Arts, Northwestern University, and The School of the Art Institute. Currently, he teaches in the UCLA Writers' Program and in the MFA Program in Creative Writing at Antioch University-Los Angeles. He is the 2022 Chair Nonfiction Committee and serves on the National Book Critics Circle (NBCC) board.

Vanessa Riley


Author

Chris Crutcher

Author, Therapist

Chris Crutcher was raised in Cascade, Idaho, a lumber and cattle ranch town located in the central Idaho Rockies.

Crutcher's years as teacher, then director, of a K-12 alternative school in Oakland, California through the nineteen-seventies, and his subsequent twenty-odd years as a therapist specializing in child abuse and neglect, inform his thirteen novels and two collections of short stories. He has also written what he calls an ill-advised autobiography titled *King of the Mild Frontier*, which was designated by "Publisher's Weekly" as "the YA book most adults would have read if they knew it existed."

Chris has received a number of coveted awards, from his high school designation as "Most Likely to Plagiarize" to the American Library Association's Margaret A. Edwards Lifetime Achievement Award. His favorites are his two Intellectual Freedom awards, one from the National Council for Teachers of English and the other from the National Coalition Against Censorship.

Five of Crutcher's books appeared on an American Library Association list of the 100 Best Books for Teens of the Twentieth Century (1999 to 2000).

Katie McCoach is a Los Angeles based developmental editor and book coach who's been helping writers get published since 2012. She works with writers to diagnose their manuscript roadblocks and give them the confidence and knowledge to grow their best stories.



Book Review!

Karen McAferty Morris Reviews Barbara Kingsolver's *Demon Copperhead*



Inspired by Charles Dickens' *David Copperfield*, this brand-new novel follows an engaging and endearing 10-year-old boy living in Appalachia who, with eyes wide open and a heartbreaking self- and world-knowledge, struggles to overcome situations that would bring most of us to our knees.

With themes of poverty, drug addiction, the horrors of foster care, and devastating personal loss, this book is not always easy to read (or hear--I listened to it in a brilliantly narrated audiobook). Yet it is so enriching to accompany this child as grows to young adulthood, and to admire the indomitable spirit that human beings often must tap into.


This narrator's voice is pitch-perfect, and often his wit and turn of phrase made me laugh out loud. The novel is peopled with characters of all kinds, all perfectly rendered. Damon, nicknamed "Demon," draws from his athletic and artistic talent, as well as his love of friends and family and desire to be part of one, in order to carry on.

Encountered near the end of the book is another theme, the common attitude of the world to look down upon the people of Appalachia, the people “of the land.” From personal experience of spending my first ten years in southern West Virginia, I know how beautiful it is, and how kind and hardworking its people can be in an environment of many challenges. Others in the ECW share the same love of these mountains. Have you read Julie DeMarko’s *Blue Ridge Childhood* or Patricia Edmisten’s “*A Quiet Beauty: Images of the Blue Ridge in Words and Photos*”? Do check them out.

Kingsolver (the author of one my very favorite books, *The Poisonwood Bible*) has written two other excellent ones, *Flight Behavior* and *Prodigal Summer*, also set in the Appalachians. (Kingsolver herself was raised in eastern Kentucky.) With *Demon Copperhead*, she has once again superbly created a fictional world to learn from, to admire, and to inspire.

I recommended *Demon Copperhead* to my brother Rick in San Diego, who told me that the library there had a 200-people hold on this book. Since no one should have to wait to read it, I ordered him a copy and can’t wait to hear what he thinks.

Include "ECW Board Nominations" in the subject line of your email, which should be sent by February 1, 2022. Please check with an individual before nominating him or her for one of the open positions. To quote from our bylaws:

- "All officers shall be nominated by membership and elected by ballot at the annual meeting by a majority of members of the Federation present and voting.
- Only those officers who have signified their consent to serve if elected shall be nominated."
- "The officers of the Federation shall consist of a President, Vice President, Secretary, and Treasurer.
- Terms of office for officers shall be two (2) years. No officer may serve more than two consecutive terms in office."
- "Directors shall be nominated and elected by the general membership of the Federation."
- "A term of office for a director is two (2) years. Directors may be reelected to subsequent terms, but may not serve more than two (2) consecutive terms."
- The four open positions are Vice President, Secretary, and 2 Board Members.
